Scholarships for Military Children Program

Applications for the 2012 Scholarships for Military Children Program are available at commissaries worldwide as well as online at www.militaryscholar.org. The program awards at least one \$1,500 scholarship to a student at each commissary. To be eligible for a scholarship, the student must be a dependent, unmarried child, no older than 21 – or 23, if enrolled as a full-time student at a college or university – of a service member on active duty, Reservist, or retiree. They also can be a survivor of a military member who died while on active duty or survivor of a retiree.

The applicant must also plan to attend or already attend an accredited college or university, full time, in the fall of 2012 or be enrolled in a program of studies designed to transfer directly into a four-year program. Applicants must submit an essay on a topic outlined at www.militaryscholar.org. Applications must be turned in to a commissary by close of business Feb. 24.

Tillman Military Scholar

Applications for the Tillman Military Scholar will be accepted Feb. 13 – Mar. 16. Those who qualify include veterans and active duty service members; both pre- and post-9/11 service; from all branches of the



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
